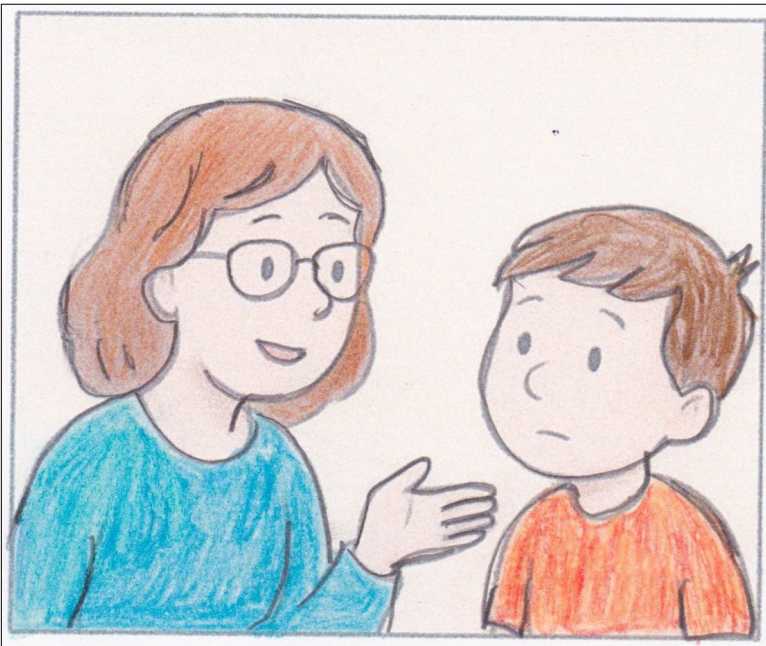


Tom and Cortical Visual Impairments



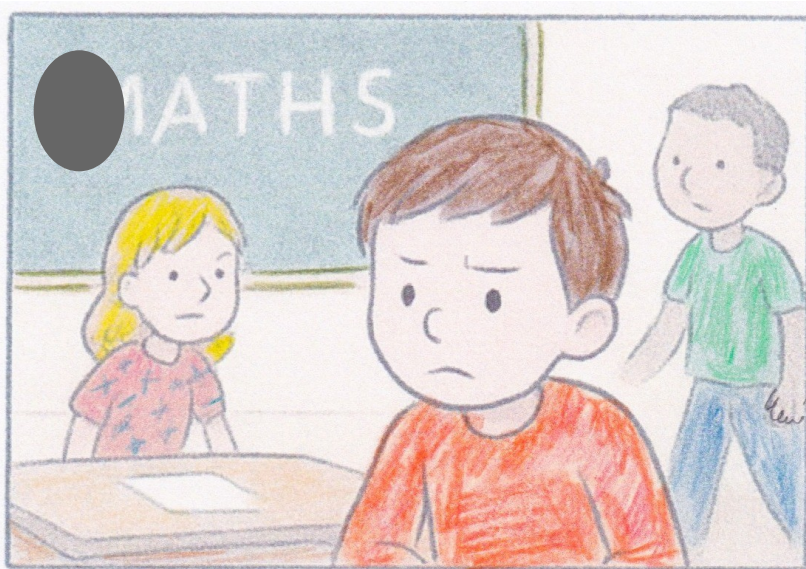

But he's having trouble writing on his paper... The letters all look the same... Tom tries squinting to read... it tires him out a lot. The words on the board are hard to read too...

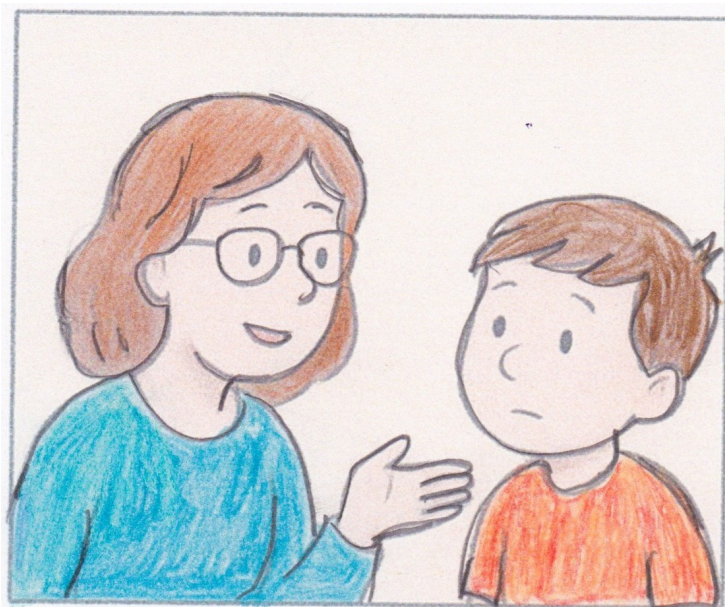


Letters seem to be disappearing. His classmates also think he's not making an effort. His eyesight, however, seems perfect... he doesn't need glasses.

One day, his parents take him to see Florence Balestrino, with whom he does some tests.

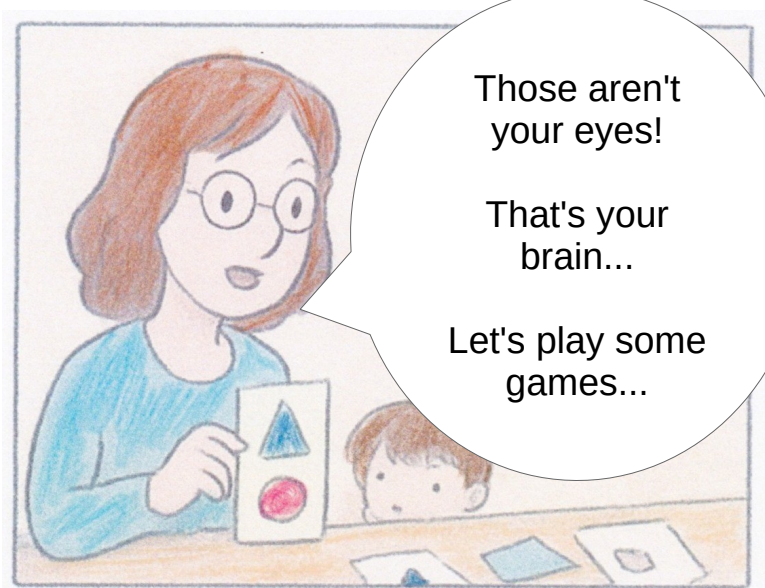


His parents discover that Tom suffers from cortical neurovisual disorders and realize that his brain cannot properly process what he perceives.

She accompanies Tom and his parents for several months.



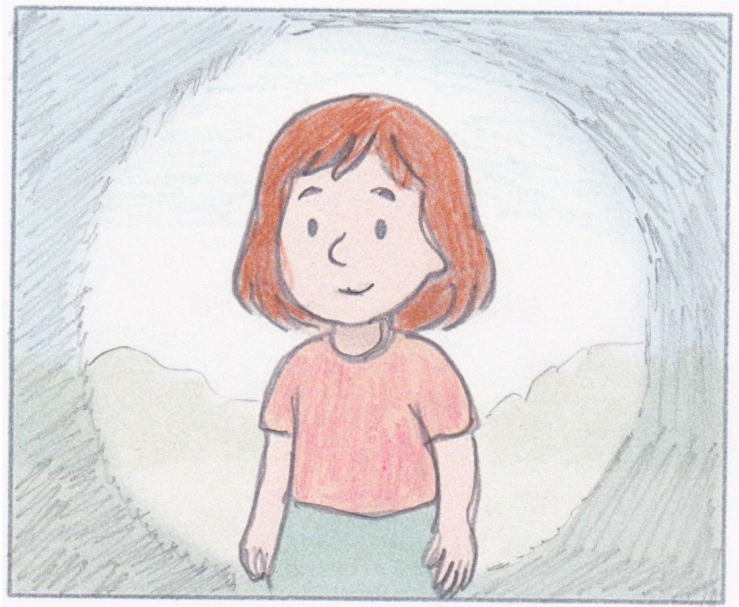
Those aren't your eyes!

That's your brain...

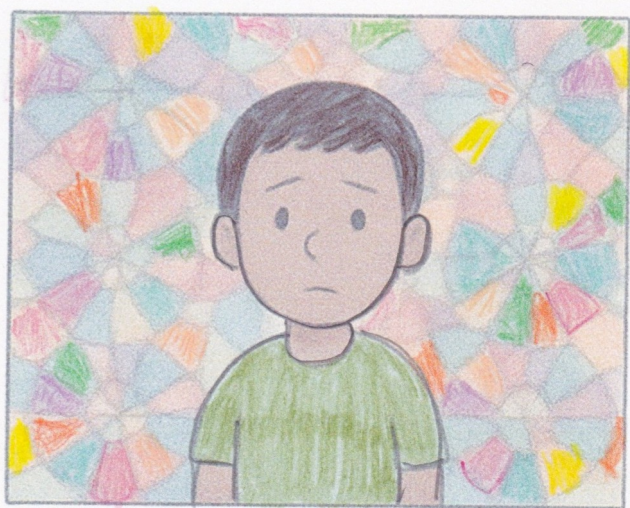
Let's play some games...

While talking with Florence Balestrino, Tom realizes he has tunnel vision.

That's why, when he looks at a classmate, he doesn't see what's around her.



So, he doesn't always understand everything.



He also learns that there are several categories of cortical neurovisual disorders.

Florence Balestrino tells him about other children she sees who are like him.



There's Kenzo, who has kaleidoscopic vision. He sees images in a strange way; as if they were overlapping.

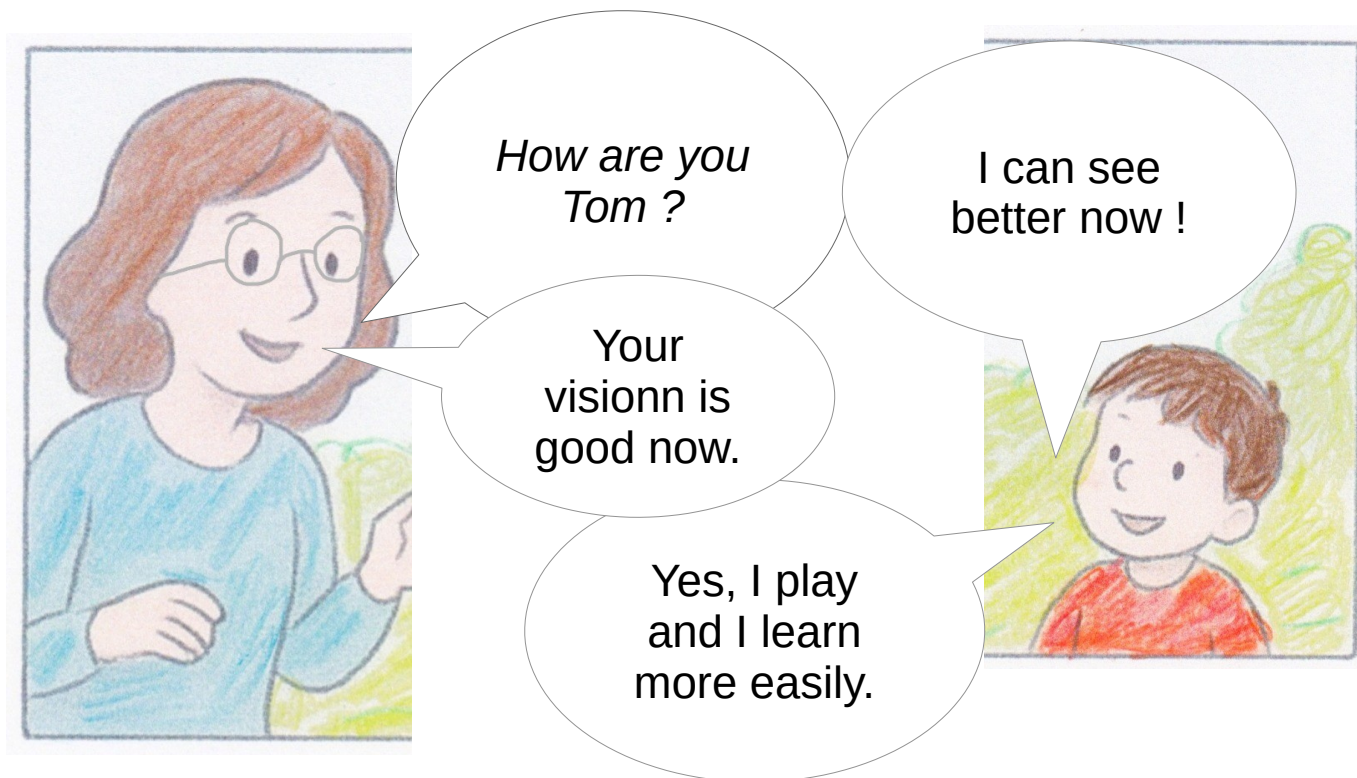
There's also Prune, who has scotomas, which makes it difficult for her to read.

He even discovers that some children do not recognize faces or objects.
